Algonquin Word of the Week

We all know that Ajashki means "Soil" in Algonquin, that Kitigan Zibi means "Garden River", and "Gichi Zibi" means "Great River". Now let's learn some more words in Algonquin language. **This week's Algonquin Word of the Week is:**

Namegobagonii'n

Namegobagonii'n means "trout lily" in Algonquin. With this sudden warm weather, the earliest flowers are starting to bloom, and trout lily is one of the first. The leaves are edible, but can taste like anything from snap peas to soap, and should be harvested sparingly. Slice up one or two to add to a salad or make a spring tonic of a tea with them.
