# Minister's Report to the Board of Directors of the First Unitarian Congregation of Ottawa April 2022

On Sunday, April 10, I preached about the anxieties many feel, primarily though I'm sure not exclusively by folks at both River Parkway and Unitarian House, about our developing campus expansion plans. I've never received so many positive comments via email to any sermon, though one lay leader did, wisely, comment that perhaps my honeymoon with FirstU will be brought to a close due to my comments. If so, I consider it a fair trade. Last week, Lisa and I sat down with Bill Van Iterson and Terry Kimmel to explore ways in which we can improve communication with the residents at Unitarian House and I was glad to join other First U Board members at a special meeting with the UH Board as well. All of this, and I'm sure more, will help ensure a smoother road forward for us all.

Also, late last month I mentioned from the pulpit that FirstU dropped its membership in the Unitarian Universalist Association some time back, and that one outcome of this is that if someone goes to UUA.org looking for a Unitarian congregation in Ottawa, they will find the Fellowship over on the east side of town but not us.
