What Does Unitarian Universalism Teach About Money?

With guest speaker Liz James

From Buddhist vows of poverty to bible stories about the widows' offering, religion has much to say about money. Unitarian Universalism tends to shy away from sweeping guidelines, and is more likely to offer us tools than instructions.

What tools does UUism offer us for how to think about the role money plays in our lives?

Reverend Liz James believes in a UUism that is filled with meaning and joy, and that sees change as an adventure. Liz is the founder of a 200,000-person online UU community, the Unitarian Universalist Hysterical Society (where ALL the proceeds of her fun products go to Flaming Chalice International); half of The Cracked Cup podcast; and is working on a book with Skinner House Press.
