## Sad News

Beryl Hunter, a long-time member of FirstU and resident of Unitarian House, passed away on February 4, 2024. Beryl was a librarian by profession serving in libraries in Toronto, Nepean, Ottawa and Library and Archives Canada. She was a prolific traveler and loved to visit countries all around the world and always had wonderful stories to tell about her many travels. She is survived by her brother, Neil. Jane Perry, a community builder, concert-class pianist, director of three choirs, gardener, dedicated vegan, and legendary gay-rights activist, served as music director for the city's First Unitarian Congregation from 2000 to 2011. Although new to Unitarianism, Ms. Perry quickly won friends by volunteering her time to lead music workshops and group singalongs at national and regional Unitarian conferences.
