# We have a NEW ADVOCACY!

In December, the Ontario Energy Board (OEB) made a well-researched decision to encourage builders of new houses in Ontario to use clean and affordable heat pumps rather than to continue the subsidization of gas service into developments. The provincial government has criticized this decision and plans to introduce legislation (Bill 165) to over-rule the OEB decision. Join us in fighting Bill 165.
