News on Dr Hassan Diab and a Parliamentary Petition

On 21 April 2023, the Special Court of Assize in Paris unjustly declared Canadian citizen Dr. Hassan Diab guilty, based on unfounded allegations and flawed intelligence. This, while his case was thrown out by the two assigned French judges who worked on his case for three years! He was sentenced in absentia to life in prison for the 1980 bombing outside a Paris synagogue. Our Congregation has been very supportive of Hassan. Please sign the parliamentary petition calling upon the Government of Canada to formally declare that Canada will neither accept nor agree to any second request from the French Government for the extradition of Dr. Hassan Diab in connection with the 1980 Paris attack.
