

Fundraising

Fall Fair

Fall Fair, our annual bazaar, is FirstU's largest fundraiser. It is a satisfying experience for some 350 volunteers.

Internal Service

Book of Gratitude

The Book of Gratitude lists people who have made exceptional financial donations to First Unitarian Ottawa. It is displayed in a case at the back of the pews in Worship Hall. Volunteers advance the pages on display each week and have new names added annually.

Caring Network*

We encourage and nurture a caring network in the Congregation. Our volunteers provide occasional transportation, phone or make personal visits to people who are ill or house bound, assist in emergencies, send caring cards, and help to organize memorial receptions for Members.

Memorial Receptions

The Memorial Receptions
Team will occasionally provide
a reception after a Memorial
Service for a member of our
congregation. Volunteers help
in setting up, serving, and
cleaning up Fellowship Hall.

Right Relations Team

Members of the FirstU Right Relations Team (RRT), guided by the congregation's covenant, provide education in healthy relations and conflict management. Members of the RRT who have relevant training and experience may act as facilitators and coaches to assist congregants in resolving their issues in the spirit of the Relational Covenant (posted on the Right Relations bulletin board outside the office).

Liaison

<u>River Parkway Children's</u> <u>Centre Liaison</u>

RPCC currently serves 54 children and is located on the FirstU campus. See riverparkwaychildrenscentre.c a for more information.

Unitarian House Liaison

Unitarian House is the seniors' residence on our campus. One person from the Congregation serves on the Unitarian House Board of Governors.

Music

Choir (Chalice)

Chalice Choir is a nonauditioned choir and everyone is welcome. Previous musical experience is helpful but not necessary.

Choir (Fusion)

Fusion is designed for experienced singers. Ability to sight-read and/or learn music quickly is an asset.

Choir (Three Rivers Singers)

Three Rivers Singers is a small women's ensemble that sings in a variety of styles, aiming to highlight female composers and themes of welcome, community, and empowerment.

Operations

Adult Library

The self-serve lending library in the Lounge contains roughly

900 books and other items on diverse subjects. In our basement archives room there is also a small collection of older books (some printed in the nineteenth century).

Archives

Our Archives serve three purposes: 1. to help us locate our internal information more easily, 2. to have readily at hand documentation we are legally required to keep and to produce upon request, and 3. to preserve the main outlines of our history for future generations of congregants.

Board of Directors

The Board (BoD) is elected annually by the Congregation to provide leadership in all aspects of the church community. The annual slate for the Board members is proposed by the Nominating Committee. Any Congregation Member may attend a Board meeting except for the portions of meetings that may be in-camera.

BookShelf

The bookshelf sells a selection of fiction, non fiction and children's books in Fellowship Hall after Sunday services.

Campus Planning Committee

The Committee assists the Board and the Congregation by studying, providing advice, and making recommendations for policies and plans related to campus planning. The committee includes non-voting representatives from our campus partners, RPCC, Or Haneshemah, and Unitarian House. The Board appoints

members from our church membership.

Embracing Diversity Committee

We plan and oversee the implementation of educational, advocacy, outreach, and community-building activities to create awareness of current realities and to build attitudes, behaviours, and practices that embrace and respect diversity of all kinds.

Friends of Meditation Garden

This team cares for the meditation garden. Volunteers are cherished - our tasks vary from deadheading and weeding to plant research.

Music Venue Volunteers

Help with music events at FirstU, circa 12 per year.

Property Team*

We oversee the operation of the Major Maintenance Fund, which involves expenditures of more than \$1,000 as part of our mandate to keep our building and campus functional, safe, and beautiful.

Sound & Light Team

The S+L Team operates audio-visual equipment for all Worship Hall events. New Operators are given technical training and shadow the Sound and Lighting Coordinator.

Stewardship Committee

Stewardship is a year-round function focussed on recognizing and celebrating the generosity of our congregation and community towards enabling our covenant. We do so through both fundraising and funraising events and activities.

We develop and implement the annual pledge campaign, orchestrate special events, act as a resource for other congregational fundraising activities, and build upon the Planned Giving program.

UU Connections Team

We make members of the Congregation more aware of Canadian Unitarian Council (CUC) and international Unitarian Universalist (UU) activities and issues by encouraging participation in webinars and other training, committees/task forces, and regional, national, and international conferences and meetings, and by recruiting delegates to represent FirstU at CUC meetings.

Personal Growth

Empower Dance

EmpowerDance is for people who wish to dance without instruction. We play many genres of music, use candlelight ,and move according to our own feelings and abilities. Please make contact for more details.

Mindfulness Meditation Group

We meet weekly. All interested in 'turning inward with patience' in a supportive and mostly silent community, are welcome to join in.

Reading for Growth (Friday)

This group meets monthly. The books cover a wide range of topics such as politics, social

issues, spiritual and religious thought and current events.

<u>Reading for Growth (non-fiction)</u>

This is a nonfiction Book Club meeting monthly on zoom. We read on a wide range of subjects choosing books that are readily available in the public library.

Spiritual Growth Circle*

This group meets monthly to seek ways to support our spiritual awakening. This group might be open to new participants at a future time.

Voyageurs Group*

A group for men focused on developing their full emotional and spiritual potential. We have bi-weekly three hour meetings and semi-annual weekend retreats. The group is small and new members are welcomed as current members move on.

Women's Personal Growth Group

The WPGG meets monthly. The common theme is growth - spiritual, mental, emotional and learning more about each other in this "Sisterhood".

Programming

Adult Learning & Growth

The Adult Learning and Growth Team coordinates ongoing groups which foster connection and community building and offers workshops and courses to deepen understanding of Unitarian Universalism and foster spiritual growth.

Hospitality Hour (Sunday)

Volunteers are recruited for Hospitality Hour (a sign up schedule is available) and training is provided. The kitchen is stocked with supplies such as snacks and hot & cold beverages. On Sundays, volunteers prepare the tables and beverages & snacks in Fellowship Hall before services and serve refreshments following. Clean up includes washing of dishes following Hospitality Hour.

OWL - Our Whole Lives

OWL is a positive, comprehensive, and age-appropriate educational program that promotes sexual health and provides accurate, developmentally appropriate information in the context of our Unitarian Universalist community. Programs for elementary aged children, youth, and adults are administered and coordinated through the Director of Religious Exploration and related groups.

W&M1 Welcome & Membership Team

There are four individual W&M groups: Greeters, Membership, Newcomer Outreach & Engagement, and Welcome Table.

W&M2 Greeters

Greeters at each Sunday service prepare the handout materials, greet people as they arrive for worship, act as ushers, assist with the elevator, and serve at the Green Mug Table. Training is offered for new volunteers.

W&M3 Membership

Handle the application process. Organize workshop to build connections with FirstU. Conduct welcome services. Report member status.

W&M4 Newcomer Outreach & Engagement

Follow up with visitors and inquiries. Organize newcomer workshop and events.

Maintain relevant information on our website.

W&M5 Welcome Table

Set up welcome table on Sundays and welcome newcomers.

Worship Team and Worship Associates

The Worship Associates work with the minister to develop and participate in Sunday services.

Zoom Hospitality Hour Team

We enable the virtual fellowship hour on Zoom following the Sunday service.

Social

Bridge Group

All levels of players are welcome to this mentally stimulating fellowship activity. The format is multi-table rotational, Chicago scoring. We meet from 7:00-9:00 pm the first Friday of the month and the third Sunday afternoon in person from September to May. Contact us or see the e-UU newsletter for dates, location, and cost.

Knitters Group

This group welcomes knitters and crocheters of any level, from beginner to expert, who enjoy creating hand-made items in a friendly, supportive setting. Using donated yarn we make a variety of goods to sell at Fall Fair, Mitten Tree, etc. or to donate to special community projects.

Men's Breakfast Group

The Men's Breakfast Group is a social group open to any man, whether a member of FirstU or not. We meet for breakfast prepared by participants on the second and fourth Friday morning of each month during most of the year. The breakfast program usually consists of a speaker and the group also provides assistance for FirstU or Unitarian House events on request.

Poetry Sharing Group

This group meets every two months on Zoom to share poetry that we love. Members are welcome to share a poem they have written, but you don't have to write in order to join us.

Trivia Quiz Night

One Monday evening monthly on Zoom. Diverse questions. Play alone or with a team.

UU Pride Group

Social & support group for 2SLGBTQ+ UUs. We meet once a month for structured discussions, fun activities, games, & socializing.

Virtual Discussion Circle

Meets weekly on Zoom to discuss a topic. Thursdays 1:30-3:00

The EAG promotes awareness of environmental issues and encourage individual actions.

Lay Chaplaincy Team

The Ottawa Lay Chaplaincy Committee (aka FirstU Lay Chaplaincy Team) serves both our congregation and the UU Fellowship of Ottawa. Active members of FirstU or the UUFO may apply to be lay chaplains.

Mental Health Support & Action Group

The MHSAG provides a listening presence and mutual support for each other. We also engage in actions to address mental health challenges in the Congregation and in the

broader society. These challenges include mental illness, addiction, dementia, and disaster anxiety, e.g., climate change, war, pandemics. We support Ancoura, a charity dedicated to providing stable, affordable housing within supportive communities for persons living with a mental illness.

Social Justice Action Network

The SJAN team co-ordinates the activities of the social responsibility working groups.

<u>Truth & Reconciliation Action</u> <u>Group</u>

In service to reconciliation, the TRAG seeks and supports relationship building between Indigenous and non-Indigenous people. We also arrange educational opportunities for our congregation.
