Elevator Training

Our elevator is a unit that is supposed to be used only when manned with an attendant. We have allowed self-serve use for a long time, and have recently been informed that we need to be operating it as intended – we can no longer leave the keys in the key slots on each door and inside the elevator car.

What this means: No longer will the keys be left in the key slots in the doors or the inside of the elevator car. There will be keys given to all staff, and anyone who operates the elevator on a regular basis, eg: Sunday morning ushers. There will be keys kept in magnetic key boxes out of the reach of children, affixed to the elevator frames. These can be used by anyone who has been trained* to use the elevator. When we have events, we will have to ensure we have a volunteer dedicated to running the elevator.

Training: Stay tuned for a simple online training that you can complete to enable you to use the elevator at will. Thanks for your patience as we roll out this new protocol. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact the office at: omr@firstunitarianottawa.ca.

*This is a requirement of the Technical Standards and Safety Authority (TSSA) for the type of elevator/lift that we have. Failure to comply could result in our losing our licence to operate the elevator.




