Elevator Training is HERE!

Our elevator is a unit that is supposed to be used only when manned with an attendant. No longer will the keys be left in the key slots in the doors or the inside of the elevator car.

- There will be keys given to all staff, and anyone who operates the elevator on a regular basis, eg: Sunday morning ushers
- There will be keys kept in magnetic key boxes out of the reach of children, affixed to the elevator frames. These can be used by anyone who has been trained* to use the elevator.

When we have events, we will have to ensure we have a volunteer dedicated to running the elevator.
