Mourning Reverend Rod Solano-Quesnel

News of Rev. Rodrigo's death comes as a shock to all of us. Many of you will remember him from his time at FirstU. While he and participated in numerous CUC zoom calls over the last two years, we only met in person at the CUC Symposium in May. Even more so in person, he impressed with with his openness, curiosity and brightness. I also loved noticing that he and his partner Sarah were always together, walking hand in hand. We have lost a leading spirit and friend.

From the CUC: Our hearts are heavy as we mourn the tragic death of Reverend Rodrigo ("Rod") Emilio Solano-Quesnel, who died at age 42 in a traffic accident early on the morning of Tuesday, July 11. We extend our deepest condolences to his family and those who knew and cared for him, especially his beloved partner Sarah Wert, who was with him at the time of the accident and suffered non-life-threatening injuries. We also extend our love and support to congregants at the Unitarian Universalist Church of Olinda, where Rev. Solano-Quesnel served as settled minister since August 2018.
