We covered a lot of ground: We reviewed and approved a budget for 2024 despite a significant deficit. We appointed a new auditor, a task long overdue. We replenished our Nominating Committee. We agreed on a new two-year Congregational Focus "Cultivating Compassionate Communities"; you'll be hearing more about this soon.



One important thing we did NOT do was proceed with a resolution to update our Charitable Purposes... at least not just yet. Our lawyer had some last-minute procedural advice for us which was too hard to address at the FCM. So we will revisit that one item at a special follow-up meeting, perhaps in late November. We regret any confusion this may have caused, but we need to get the job done correctly, and with an appropriate chance for consultation. Your comments are always welcome.

Read All About It


Want to know your ancestral roots? Want to raise funds for FirstU? Why not do both?


